Workshop Announcement Bank of England Conference Implications of the A level reforms for teaching

New A levels in economics and business are on track to be introduced for teaching in September 2015. This workshop will include a summary of current draft proposals and consider the implications for teaching of the key changes being introduced. Delegates

will also be invited to share their thoughts on how the changes are being addressed in their own institutions and to raise any issues and concerns that the EBEA might be able to assist with or pursue with awarding bodies and Ofqual.

David currently chairs the EBEA's advocacy group. This includes liaising with external bodies, including awarding bodies, Ofqual, DfE and Ofsted, to keep the membership informed about current developments and to promote economics, business and enterprise education in their best interests.

Since leaving Ofsted in 2009, he has worked as an education consultant and Ofsted inspector.
